IN MEMORY OF BONNIE C. GARDNER, 1932-2003

KPIC ON DISPLAY

All the way from the Netherlands, KPIC member Co Patist sent photos of his recent RFK exhibit. Items from his collection were displayed for the entire month of June in memory of Robert Kennedy and the 50th anniversary of Kennedy's death, at the library in his hometown of Emmen (approximately 120 miles—185km—north-northeast of Amsterdam.



The exhibition showed material from his time as Attorney General including a letter and photo of his visit to the Netherlands in February 1962. Robert Kennedy met with Queen Juliana in order to help settle the New Guinea crisis and our war with Indonesia. Also on display were items from his campaign and work as Senator from

New York (letter, campaign material) and items from his 1968 campaign for the presidency.


